

Dear Exhibitors and Friends,

Welcome to Colonial Carriage & Driving Society's 24th Annual Pleasure Driving Show. Colonial Carriage & Driving Society and Orleton Farm are proud to play a part in promoting the history and tradition of pleasure driving here in the Berkshire Hills. The Berkshires had great history in the gilded age with the large estates and wonderful carriage houses as the place to come and be seen driving your horse and carriage. Harvey and Mary make their home at Orleton Farm, which has been in Mary's family since 1900 and has always been a horse facility. The grounds have become home to Colonial Carriage for it's many events held here throughout the year: sleigh rallies, clinics, fun day, club meetings, and the pleasure show.

The show started 25 years ago at famous sculptor Daniel Chester French's home, Chesterwood, in Stockbridge, Massachusetts. The show continued there for three years, with the number of exhibitors and spectators increasing each year. The need for more space prompted the show to move to Eden Hill, one of Stockbridge's great estates. In 2006, with the desire to add more classes, the show expanded to a two-day show and moved to Orleton Farm. A third day was added in 2011, expanding the show with more classes and divisions for our exhibitors.

The Orleton Farm Pleasure Driving Show, Combined Test and Driving Trial is a unique event. In 2016 the show expanded to a four-day event to further accommodate the increasing interest in this venue. We continue that format in 2023. There are classes and divisions for everyone. The first day offers the Combined Test and Driving Trial for VSEs, ponies and horses with Dressage and Cone classes and the Marathon. On Friday morning, the Pleasure Show kicks off with Turnout classes and Timed Obstacles for all divisions, followed by the Cross Country Obstacle classes in the afternoon. The three-day pleasure driving show 2023 schedule will continue to offer the Utility Vehicle Division, a Park Division, and a Picnic Class along with an American Heritage class and the Ride and Drive class. We also offer a Tandem Division and Unicorn/Four-in-Hand Division and continue with a Coaching Division added in 2019. The Maiden Horse/Pony Division and the Trade and Commercial Vehicle Classes will also be offered. We added three invitational classes; Best Lady Whip, Best Gentleman Whip, Concours d'Elegance in 2022 to close out the show on Sunday. The gathering of Vintage Automobiles will also be on display Sunday.

Our stabling opens at noon **Tuesday, August 8,** for those who want to come early. Exhibitors are invited to the Pizza Party Wednesday evening followed by the Exhibitor's Briefing for the Combined Test and Driving Trial, starting on Thursday. Burgers and light fare will be available for purchase Thursday evening at 6:00 PM with beer and wine provided by Orleton Farm. Thursday evening will include presentation of the Combined Test and Driving Trial awards. The briefing for Pleasure Show classes will take place Thursday night. Friday night will offer a wine and beer reception with light fare and entertainment. Saturday night features a BBQ open to exhibitors, family, and friends. Please purchase tickets with your entry.

As our show continues to grow, we are dedicated to make your experience the best possible in these uncertain times, with safety and fun in mind! The entire show staff joins our excitement, after what may still be an uncertain year, in providing the return to competition in 2023. This year, we will again follow any challenging COVID guidelines of the American Driving Society as well as state and local government.

The show relies on the friendly volunteers from Colonial Carriage. They are committed to making your show experience the best possible — without them, the show would not go on. You can identify our volunteers from their club shirts. They can help with any questions you may have about the show or Colonial Carriage. We also take this opportunity to thank all competitors for participating, sponsors, and advertisers for their support, and all spectators for coming. The multi-day show schedule comes with certain financial risk for Colonial Carriage. Entry fees and other showing fees alone do not cover the cost of the running the show. DRIVING SHOW CONDITIONS AND RULES

- 1. The Committee reserves the right to eliminate or consolidate classes as entries warrant; THREE (3) entries minimum.
- 2. Entries close July 10, 2023. Post entries may be accepted after that date at an additional \$25 per class, room permitting. However, post entries will not appear in the published program.
- 3. Entry Fees: Checks payable to Colonial Carriage (CCDS)
 - **COMBINED TEST** Dressage and Cones driven by a single whip (1 dressage test and cones): \$150 (\$200 after July 10).
 - **DRIVING TRIAL** combination of scores for dressage, cones and marathon: \$200 (\$250 after July 10).
 - PLEASURE DRIVING SHOW \$200 per division (6 classes) (i.e., Turnout, Reinsmanship, Ring Obstacles, Cross Country Obstacle, Timed Obstacle, Working) and/or \$40 per individual class. Any division with less than 6 classes or the special classes will be charged at the individual class rate of \$40 per class

LATE FEE – \$25 additional per class or \$100 per division after July 10, 2023.

OFFICE PROCESSING FEE – \$40 per whip.

- 4. For non-ADS members, there is a required fee of \$30 for the event payable to ADS.
- 5. Liability waiver must be signed by the exhibitor and anyone riding on the vehicle. Any exhibitor driving or carrying a passenger is subject to disqualification if the waiver has not been signed by all parties. All essential persons, as described in the ADS COVID Action Plan, must be listed on the entry form
- 6. Numbers will not be assigned without payment of all fees, properly signed entry forms, ADS disclaimer, a negative Coggins test taken within 1 year and a current rabies vaccination certificate, and influenza/rhino vaccine certificate for each equine. Pony measurement cards must be included.
- 7. Numbers will not be issued until vehicle wheel measurements are on file with the secretary.
- 8. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle or leaving an animal unattended while hitched anywhere on the show grounds will result in immediate elimination.
- 9. All drivers must carry a whip, wear a hat, apron and gloves while driving their equines.
- 10. An EMT/EMS, veterinarian, and farrier will be on call.
- 11. Course maps for the cones and cross-country obstacle course and marathon will be available at the show.
- 12. Stalls are available at \$300 for any part or all of the show, with two bags of shavings, check payable to Colonial Carriage (CCDS). A deposit of \$25.00 is required per stall by separate check made payable to Colonial Carriage, which will be returned after clean stall verification. Stall reservations and payment must be made by July 10, 2023.

- 13. Refunds on entries will be made, minus a \$40 processing fee, only upon the receipt of a Veterinarian's Certificate or Physician's certificate attesting to the inability of the animal or whip to participate due to illness or injury. These certificates MUST be received prior to the opening of the show on August 10, 2023. Stall fees are not refundable.
- 14. There is a \$50.00 grounds fee per horse or pony for showing out of your trailer, for one or for all days of the show, payable with your entry.
- 15. All dogs must be leashed at all times. Dogs found to be unleashed will be impounded and may be reclaimed upon payment of a \$50.00 fine. All dog waste must be picked up and disposed of.
- 16. Golf carts will be available for 4-day rental at \$350 each.
- 17. 13 Camper spots with water and electric hookup (no waste) are available for \$150. First come first serve!
- 18. Combined Test and Driving Trial participants must wear protective helmets in Cones classes and on marathon, Driving Trial participants must also wear protective vests on marathon.
- 19. The American Driving Society Code of Sportsmanship

Our sport of Carriage Driving has the valuable reputation of being welcoming to all, a sport where the welfare of the horse is formost, and the thrill is in the partnership with our equines (regardless of the results). Protecting these ideals is of paramount importance to the health of driving.

In order for the sport of driving to prosper, our expectation is that ever participant knows the rules, plays fairley, graciously accepts the final results, and always conducts themselves in a composed manner. It is the duty of all to behave in a manner that creates a prositive environment.

Therefore, any infringement of the common priciples of good behavior fairness or good sportsmanship will result in disciplinary action. Sportsmanship infractions include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a) Abusive or intimidating language at ADS Recognized Events.
- b) Refusal to accept Officials' fnal decisions.
- c) Intentional circumventing of the ules.
- d) Unsafe behavior while on event grounds.
- e) Damaging land or property.
- f) Actions detrimental to the welfare of the horse.
- g) Negative interaction with volunteers.
- h) The use of social media, or any public platform to personally attack the character or reputation of fellow competitors, organizers, volunteers, or officals.

We have a duty to each other and to our sport to display good sportsmanship.

When our members display good sportsmanship, it not only makes driving more enjoyable for all, but presents a positive impression of the driving communit to the general public.

Let us always do the right thing for our equine companions, our sport, and our fellow ADS members.

PLEASURE DRIVING SHOW DIVISION AND CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Tandem Division: Open to horse and pony tandems. **Novice to Drive Division:** Open to single horse/pony drivers and will be governed by ADS rules, Article 31.2. **Junior to Drive Division:** Open to whips 18 years of age or younger as of Jan 1 2016. 13 years of age or younger to be accompanied by an adult. Helmets are required.

Utility Division: Open to single pony and single horse put to a two or four-wheeled training/marathon type vehicle not suitable for any other division or class. Pneumatic tires acceptable in the Utility Division. Attire should be appropriate for a pleasure show (hat, apron, gloves, whip). No cross entries with this vehicle.

American Heritage Turnout Class: Open to all who are turned out to a "turn of the century" or Currier and Ives type of appearance. Please provide a detailed description and history to the announcer prior to the class.

Park Division:

Park Turnout: To be shown in an appropriate antique or antique type vehicle (i.e., Gig, Pheton) turned out in formal "Park" style. To be shown both ways of the arena at a park walk, park trot, and "show your horse" (a smart trot without excessive speed). Entries should stand quietly in the line-up. 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, spares and appointments, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression 30% on performance, manners and way of going.

Park Performance: A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on gaits (See ADS Article 210.11). To be shown in an appropriate antique or antique type vehicle (i.e., Gig, Phaeton) turned out in formal "Park" style. To be shown both ways of the arena at a park walk, park trot, and "show your horse" (a smart trot without excessive speed). Entries should stand quietly in the line-up. 70% on performance, quality of horse, and manners 30% on overall impression.

Picnic Class: A pleasure driving class in which entries are judged primarily on the performance and quality of turnout as well as the presentation of a picnic. Competitors will be asked to work their turnout both directions of the arena, then retreat to a designated picnic area. The horse will be unhitched and taken back to the stable area while the participants prepare their picnic for viewing. All picnic participants and their amenities must be part of the turnout during the arena portion of the class. The judge (or honorary judges) will visit the picnic area and competitors will describe the type of picnic they are presenting.

Old Guard Class: Open to exhibitors 65 years of age or older wishing to show a single, pair, unicorn, or four-in-hand of horse(s), pony(ies), or other equine(s). A pleasure driving class, it will be judged both ways of the ring at a walk, slow trot, and working trot, and entries may be asked to walk when reversing across the diagonal and when lining up. Entries should stand quietly in the lineup. All entries chosen for a workout may be worked both ways of the arena at any gait requested by the judge and may be asked to execute a figure of eight.

Ride and Drive: Turn out to be shown as a driven working pleasure class both ways of the arena to an appropriate pleasure vehicle. The turnout will then retire and the whip will return in appropriate "English" riding attire to ride the horse or pony both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter.

Unicorn/Four-in-Hand Division: Open to horse or pony multiple turnouts in the Unicorn or Four-in-Hand arrangement.

Maiden Horse/Pony: Open to equines who have never won a blue ribbon at an ADS event.

Trade & Commercial: Open to exhibitors with any configuration of equines put to an appropriate and authentic vehicle used in the trades or commercial ventures. Orleton Farm Rules.

Coaching Division

This division is for horse or pony four-in-hand teams put to a Road Coach, Private Coach, Park Drag or other suitable four-in-hand vehicles. Park Drags, Private Coaches and Road Coaches are not to be asked to back in any class. The rules for competition are based on the old coaching traditions. More information on these turnouts is available in the following books: On the Box Seat by Tom Ryder; Manual of Coaching by Fairman Rogers; Carriage Turnout and Appointments by the Carriage Association of America. Pleasure Entries will be judged both ways of the ring at an even trot, and may walk when reversing across the diagonal and when lining up. Horses to stand quietly in the line-up. Judged on performance, quality, manners of the horses, and correct appointments. Turnout Entries to be shown at an even trot, both ways of the ring. May walk when reversing across the diagonal and when lining up. Horses to stand quietly in the line-up. Judged on performance, quality, manners of the horses, and correct appointments. Obstacle Driving drivers negotiate a course of paired markers set at the widest track width plus 20 inches. At the end of the course, the driver halts the team with his front hub on a line between a pair of designated markers. A measurement is taken of the distance of the hub from the line. Five faults are assessed for each foot or part thereof the center of the hub is from the line. Two or more horses cantering at the same time will be considered a break in gait. Failure to correct a break in gait within 5 seconds will incur 10 faults for each commenced period of 5 seconds.

Modern Presentation Vehicle Division

This division is for horses or ponies put to modern CDE type presentation vehicles. These vehicles may not cross enter any other classes. Attire should be appropriate for pleasure driving.

Concours d'Elegance / Anne Bliss Memorial Trophy

Invitational class for those exhibitors whose turnout presents the most elegant affect in the opinion of the judges. This includes vehicle, harness, appointments, horse(s), driver, passengers, grooms, etc. Performance will not be judged unless it detracts from the elegance of the tournout.

Best Lady Whip

Exhibitors earning highest points in each division will be invited to enter the ring to be judged as a reinsmanship class to determine Best Lady Whip.

Best Gentlemen Whip

Exhibitors earning highest points in each division will be invited to enter the ring to be judged as a reinsmanship class to determine Best Gentlemen Whip.
